From 2005 to 2006 David Kibuuka provided a magical opportunity for 55 young people who were interested in using art as a medium for expression.

The objective was to provide participants, aged 16-24, unemployed and not registered in full-time school, who had an interest in visual arts, with an opportunity to further develop their talents through exposure to the modern African visual art fragmentation technique, perfected by Kibuuka.

David not only extended himself as an accomplished artist, teacher and technician, but he was able to connect with the young participants in a way which allowed them to feel free and confident in exploring their inner creative selves. The products were nothing short of miraculous. Images which came to life over the course of 5 days confirmed and celebrating the efforts of all involved.
